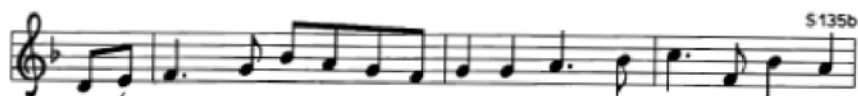

Change in Method of Receiving Communion

As previously noted, starting today we will resume using the communion rail so that we gather around the altar to receive the elements rather than receiving them in procession as has been our recent custom.

Please follow the directions of the ushers, with the right side (facing the altar) leaving their seats by the side aisle, going around to the back by the Baptismal Font, and assuming the furthest spot at the altar rail, starting at the right side. You may stand or kneel to receive the elements. We will continue to use the wafers and communion cups. You may leave the cup on the altar rail once you are finished. Those wishing to receive a blessing rather than the elements may signify this by crossing their arms over their heart.

Once you have received the elements, you may rise and return to your seat by the side aisle for meditation and/or prayer. Other communicants will then fill in the empty spots so that communion will move continuously.
